Attributes of God Sermon Notes... God's Infinite Strength - Isaiah 40:18-31

God's infinite strength compared to man's <u>impotent</u> idols. (Isaiah 40:18-20)
God's infinite strength is demonstrated in His power over all people. (Isaiah 40:21-24)
God's infinite strength is demonstrated in His power over the stars. (Isaiah 40:25-26)
God infinite strength gives power to those who wait for Him. (Isaiah 40:27-31)
Discussion & Application Questions
1. What did you find helpful, confusing, or challenging about the study of Isaiah 40?

- 2. How have you been reminded of the limitations of your own strength?3. What is an idol? Why are idols impotent?
- 4. What idol is your heart tempted to put your trust in? How have you seen these idols to be impotent and a false object of trust in your own life?
- 5. Why was David able to have such courage to face the giant enemy named Goliath? How does this story inspire you to trust in God's power more fully?

- 6. What examples of the short-lived power of man and nations can you recall from history? What should this teach us?
- 7. How does looking at the night sky filled with stars teach us about the power of God? When is the last time you did some worshipful star-gazing?
- 8. Isaiah 40:31 teaches us that God gives His strength to those who "wait" for Him. What does it mean to "wait" for the Lord? What does this waiting for the Lord look like in your own life?
- 9. What are some of the many areas where Christians need the strength of the Lord? Specifically, where do you need the Lord's strength in your own life?
- 10. In 2 Corinthians 12:9 the scripture says that the Lord's "strength is made perfect in weakness". How have you seen the Lord show His strength through your weaknesses?
