You must decide who you will worship. (I Kings 18:20-24)

A false god will always let you down. (I Kings 18:25-29)

The true God demonstrates that He alone is God. (I Kings 18:30-40)

Discussion & Application Questions

- 1. What did you find helpful, confusing, or challenging about the study of I Kings 18?
- 2. Does God still call us to choose if we will love and worship Him or idols? (see Matthew 6:24)
- 3. At the moment of salvation, is it necessary that we turn from idols in order to turn to Jesus and trust in Him for forgiveness? (see I Thessalonians 1:9 & Galatians 5:24)
- 4. What does it look like in your life to have an undivided heart of love and worship for the true God?
- 5. Has God ever placed you in a situation where you had to choose between loyalty to Him or something/someone else? If you were loyal, what helped you to remain loyal to the LORD? If you stumbled, how did you recover? (see I John 1:9 & I John 5:21)
- 6. Why do false gods always let us down? How have you seen this to be true in your own life or in the lives of others around you? (see Ecclesiastes 1-2 & Ecclesiastes 12:13-14)
- 7. Did the earnestness, intensity, and sincerity of those worshipping the false god Baal in I Kings 18:28 make their actions any better or make them any more likely to get the results they sought?
- 8. Why is it not enough to be sincere in our religious pursuit? Why must we also have the correct object for our trust and worship?
- 9. When the LORD demonstrated that He alone is God and not Baal, how did the people watching respond in I Kings 18:39? Have you had moments of reverent awe like this?
- 10. Elijah asked God in I Kings 18:37 to show His power in order to prove to the people that He is God and to turn their hearts back to Him. How could we pray a similar prayer in our own day?
