Questions for Discussion & Application:

5. Why would it be easier to speak the truth in love, confess sin, and forgive one another within a church culture of really caring for one another as a family?
6. What things can your Community Group do to help grow a culture of caring for one another as family?
7. What is an example from your own life of the church being a family to you and helping you in a time of need?
8. Is it more difficult for you to share in order to meet a need or to receive the help of others? Why? Why are both important?
9. What are some of the many different ways that we can care for one another and help meet the needs of one another as a family?

10. Is it ever difficult for you to show generosity to others in your Community group or church family? How does the Gospel help us to overcome these difficulties and inspire generosity?
