- 3. Discuss the following statement: It is a greater sin to say nothing to your brother about his sin than it is to do a poor job saying something to your brother from the motivation of love.
- 4. Why is it loving for a church community to hold one another accountable? (see also Galatians 6:1, Hebrews 3:13, James 5:16, etc.)
- 5. How can corrective care be carried out in a way that makes the motivation of love very clear?
- 6. What are some reasons that we may find it difficult to practice this kind of mutual accountability towards one another? Why might this be difficult for you?
- 7. If sin is not lovingly corrected within a church community, as the Scripture instructs, what will be some of the harmful results?
- 8. Who is the last person that lovingly corrected you through a difficult conversation? Do you appreciate them for this conversation?

- 9. What can you do to better welcome and encourage accountability from other believers into your own life?
- 10. How would you pray for someone who has been removed from church membership through the process of corrective care?
