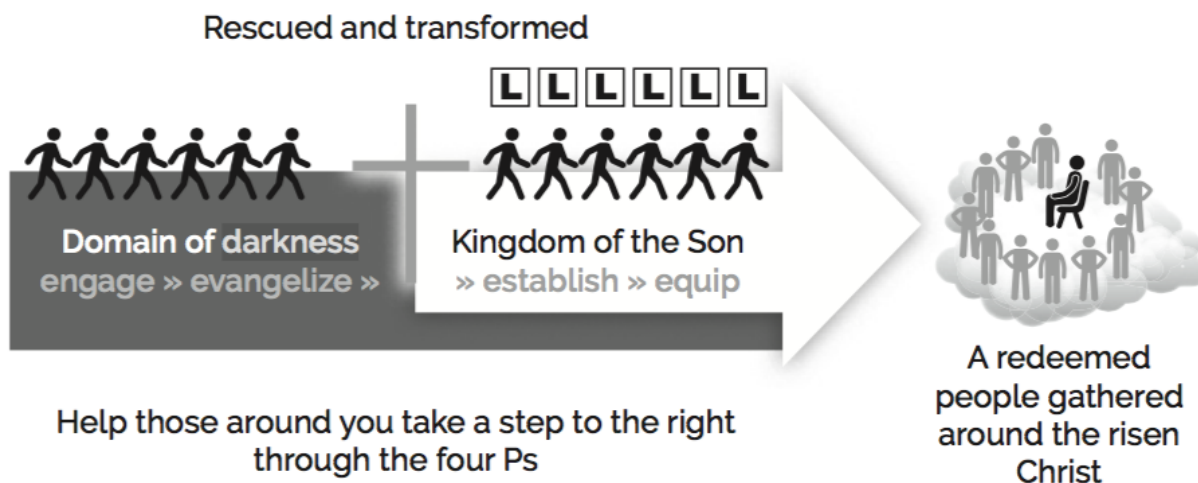


## Church-Wide Discipleship Plan:

### Vision Statement: Making and Maturing disciples for the glory of God

This vision statement is illustrated below:



We hope to see people “move to the right” on the 4 E spectrum above:

<u>Engage</u>	<u>Evangelize</u>	<u>Establish</u>	<u>Equip</u>
Meeting new people & getting to know them on a personal level (1 Thessalonians 2:8)	Sharing the Gospel & God’s truth in hopes that others would become disciples of Jesus (Matthew 28:19-20)	Teaching disciples of Jesus what it means to mature in the faith (Colossians 2:6-7)	Training disciples to engage in the process of making and maturing disciples (2 Timothy 2:2)

As people “move to the right” they will inevitably be “looking to the left” to see who they can bring along with them as they move towards maturity in Christ.

We hope to see people “move to the right” through the 4 Ps:

<u>Proclamation</u>	<u>Prayer</u>	<u>People</u>	<u>Patience</u>
We believe that God works through the sharing of Scripture at every level from everyday conversations to preaching (Hebrews 4:12)	We believe that God works through his people as we depend upon Him in prayer (Acts 2:42)	We believe that God works through <b>ALL</b> of his people as they share the Word and pray (1 Peter 4:9-11)	We believe that God calls us to be patient with each other as this process of making and maturing disciples occurs one step at a time (1 Thessalonians 5:14)

(As Community Group Leaders our goal is to assess where group members are on the 4 E spectrum and seek to partner people into Intentional Discipleship Relationships<sup>1</sup> that encourages movement to the right)

<sup>1</sup> Examples of Intentional Discipleship relationships include accountability partners, discipling new believers, mentoring relationships, etc.
