

Colossians 2:6-15 – Complete in Christ: Walking confidently in Christ’s Sufficiency

6-7 – A call to faithfulness, keep following Christ

The central confession of the early church was ‘Jesus is Lord.’

Continue walking with Christ as Lord

8 – Watch out that nothing undermines your trust in Christ

9 – Christ is sufficient because He is fully God

10 – 14 – In Christ, you lack nothing

10 – In Jesus, you are completely filled

11-12 – In Jesus, you are completely set apart for God

13-14 – In Jesus, you are completely alive through complete forgiveness

15 – Christ is sufficient because He is victorious

Questions:

1. What was confusing, convicting, or encouraging from this study of Scripture?
2. The central confession of the early church was ‘Jesus is Lord.’ What are the implications of this statement for the world, the church, the home, and your life?
3. Why do you think Paul sees thankfulness as the believer’s necessary response to salvation (see Colossians 1:12; 2:7; 3:16; 4:2)? What is thankfulness? What does thankfulness look like for you as a Christian?
4. In 2:8, Paul commands believers to watch out for harmful beliefs that would undermine their faith. What are the potential philosophies or worldviews that can tempt believers to look for fullness outside of Christ?
5. In 2:9-15, Paul provides several reasons to cling to Christ and no other. Why do you think Paul focuses on what is right and true instead of emphasizing what is wrong with the false teaching?
6. In 2:9-15, which statement about Christ or about our status in Christ is most encouraging to you? Why?
7. By God’s grace, what needs to change in your life based on this study of Colossians 2:6-15?
