God's just anger burned hot against a <u>stiff-necked</u> nation.
Moses <u>interceded</u> for Israel.
Moses appealed to God's glory in his prayer.
Moses appealed to God's <u>promises</u> in his prayer.
Moses' prayer is <u>answered</u> .

- 1. Do you have any questions about the meaning of today's passage?
- 2. Why does God refer to Israel as Moses' people and as a "stiff-necked" people? Is this a fair assessment of Israel? (See also Exodus 5:21, 14:10-12, 15:24, 16:2-3, & 17:1-3.)
- 3. How does the label "stiff-necked" accurately describe all of humanity? (See Romans 1:18-32.)
- 4. Moses interceded on behalf of the nation of Israel and appealed to God to be merciful. How is this a foreshadowing of Jesus as our high priest who intercedes on our behalf? (See Hebrews 7:24-25.)
- 5. In Moses' prayer for Israel, he appealed to God's glory and God's promises. How can these same things shape and inform the content of our prayers?
- 6. What are some specific promises that God has made to us as Christians that should shape our praying? (See Matthew 28:18-20, Acts 1:8, Romans 8:28-29, & Matthew 6:33 for examples.)
- 7. How does today's passage speak truth into your life and challenge you personally?
