The Apostle <u>Paul</u> wrote to a troubled <u>church</u> in the unholy city of <u>Corinth</u> .
The Apostle Paul gave <u>thanks</u> to God for <u>saving</u> the Corinthian believers, for giving <u>gifts</u> of the Spirit to them, and for his confidence that God would <u>sustain</u> them.

- 2. In what ways is our own American culture increasingly like that of Corinth?
- 3. How does our own culture sometimes have too great of an influence upon the church in America?
- 4. Why can we be confident, despite the opposition of our culture, that some will believe in Jesus? What should this lead us to do? (See Acts 18:9-10.)
- 5. How many times, in today's passage, is Jesus mentioned? Why might this be significant?
- 6. Why is it so surprising that Paul is thankful to God for the Corinthian Church? What can we learn from Paul's example?
- 7. How does today's passage speak truth into your life and challenge you personally?
