## The Necessity of the Resurrection – I Corinthians 15:12-20

To <u>deny</u> that Christians will be physically resurrected from the dead is also a denial that Jesus physically rose from the dead.

The consequences of <u>denying</u> the resurrection are disastrous! If the resurrection were not true, then...

- o our preaching would be in vain
- o our faith would be in vain
- we would misrepresent God
- o we would still be in our sins
- those who have died would have perished
- we would be most to be pitied

Jesus has risen from the dead and His resurrection shows the future for all who die in Christ.
