

What Do These Stones Mean? – Joshua 4:1-24

God miraculously opened the door through the Jordan River as a sure sign that He had rightly given the land to Israel.

God instructed Israel to take twelve stones from the bed of the Jordan River and to set up a memorial from these stones that would serve as a reminder to future generations of this miracle.

The miraculous crossing of the Jordan River was to show all the peoples of the earth that the hand of the LORD is mighty and that His people might fear Him forever.

Questions for Discussion & Application

5. What memorial did Jesus give to us as His church?
6. How has the Lord's Supper been personally helpful to you in remembering God's grace?
7. Why is it important that our children see this sign and memorial of the Lord's Supper?
