3. How does the fear of dying enslave people? How does Jesus set us free from this enslavement?
4. When someone is liberated from the fear of death, how does their life become different?
5. What does it mean that Jesus made "propitiation for the sins of the people"?
6. How have you found it helpful, as you face temptation, to know that Jesus has also faced temptation?
7. How will you apply this passage to your own life?
